

III. PUBLIC APPEARANCES.

Mr. Tom Bailey, Executive Director, Little Traverse Conservancy

Mr. Tom Bailey, Executive Director of Little Traverse Conservancy, made some comments on the Village of Mackinaw City's application (12-022). The village now has commitments for half of their local match and fund-raising continues.

The project is for a 20-acre parcel on the north shore of Lake Charlevoix, with 1400 feet of lake access. Acquisition would provide access to Lake Charlevoix for residents and visitors for fishing, swimming and boating access. The property is currently a girl's summer camp. A band camp is also held on the property.

A "Committee to Protect Hayes Township", who has been in opposition to the acquisition, has pledged \$100,000 towards the match if the project is modified to include a non-motorized boating component that eliminated the parking and boat launch area down by the lakefront. The township turned this proposal down, as we are just in the acquisition stage at this point, and not development. Also, the township did not feel it was fair to remove amenities based on a donation.

Ms. Fountain further stated that this is a once in a lifetime opportunity, and have had overwhelming support in public hearings, however, there are some residents opposed to the project. She provided a copy of a newspaper article where residents expressed their opposition.

The property is centrally located between Boyne City and Charlevoix.

The MNRTF grant request is for \$3,375,000. The township has committed \$500,000 towards match, and is in the process of fund-raising the remaining \$625,000.

Mr. Charters pointed out that this project would be seven miles from a state park. Since the MNRTF has reached its cap, the DNR and the MNRTF Board need to come up with a strategic plan to define what the MNRTF's goals are. We need to determine how far from public lake access points do we want. He is not just talking about state access, but townships, counties and cities/villages as well. In the future, the MNRTF cannot afford to buy a public access site because it is the last great piece of property. Strategic goals for acquisition need to be developed.

Director Stokes responded that he agrees with Mr. Charters, and the DNR will be developing a state strategic plan, but at the same time the local units of governments also have desires, as well. We need to make sure that what we develop as a state agency does not infringe on the rights of others. It is hoped that this strategic plan is a guide that both state and local units of governments can use.

Director Stokes asked where, as referenced in the newspaper article, "Park #134" came from. Ms. Fountain is not sure where that came from---perhaps the number in the county or in the whole state. The residents opposed to the project came up with this number.

Mr. Cummings added he supports Mr. Charters' concerns regarding the need for a strategic plan for the MNRTF. He also added he supports Mr. Charters' concern as to spending \$3,375,000 for public lake access when there is a state park seven miles away. He was also skeptical about the purchase price—this is more than \$200,000 per acre. Ms. Fountain responded that an appraisal had been done, and new appraisal may come in at a little less amount.

Mr. Warren Nugent, Hayes Township Resident – 12-036, Camp Seagull Acquisition-Lake Charlevoix, Hayes Township

Mr. Warren Nugent, a resident of Hayes Township, made a presentation in opposition to the Camp Seagull Acquisition-Lake Charlevoix project submitted by Hayes Township (12-036). He does not know what the "Park 134" means.

Mr. Nugent stated he is not opposed to the park, but rather the high cost of the property. This is a small township and some of the large uses of the park, such as the boat taunch, he is opposed to. He would be in support of a compromise of the acquisition by making a smaller park. He believes the majority of the people would like to see this property preserved and not developed. With the proposed park plans, this would be a development.

Mr. Nugent asked the Board to look at both the township's presentation and the opposition's information.

Chairperson Garner stated that it is not the Board's position to change a community's proposal. The Board merely approves or disapproves projects. The application will go through a complete review by Grants Management staff and be scored.

Director Stokes added that he has a problem when an individual offers \$100,000 to keep the public off the lake.

Mr. Scott Erickson, City Manager, City of Ironwood – 12-123, Michigan's Western Gateway Trail Improvements, City of Ironwood

Mr. Scott Erickson, City Manager for the City of Ironwood, made a presentation in support of the Michigan's Western Gateway Trail Improvements project (12-123). He provided handouts of the project for the Board's information.

The city has been working with a regional trail technical working group on this project for the past three years, as well as DNR staff. The trail starts in Ironwood and borders Wisconsin to the west. The Western Gateway Regional Trail will connect to Hurley, Wisconsin on the west and travel through Ironwood, Bessemer and Wakefield.

The City of Ironwood has been working with Gogebic County, cities of Bessemer and Wakefield, townships and other organizations on this project. The "Strengthening Our Niche" work group created the Regional Trail Concept in 2008. There are about 100 people involved in this work group.

The project will include trail construction along the rail corridor. There are two trail corridors parallel to each other from Wisconsin to Wakefield. One of the corridors is a motorized trail corridor and the other non-motorized. There are two trailheads that have been approved in 2011 (Depot Park Trailhead) (cities of Ironwood and Bessemer) and are awaiting funding approval.

The trail project will be for 2-1/2 miles of an approximately 11-mile trail from Ironwood to Wakefield. The rail corridor acquisition will be going to the Natural Resources Commission for approval on June 14.

Performance Engineers was approached by Hayes Township to develop a feasibility plan for a boat launch at the Camp Seagull Property. See Attached e-mails. Also see Board of Trustee minutes of October 24, 2012 which it is stated by Marlene Golovich that "a feasibility study was done and Ms. Golovich provided this to the Board."

Mr. Trevor VanDyke, DNR Legislative Liaison - MNRTF Legislative Updates

Mr. Trevor VanDyke, DNR Legislative Liaison, outlined several Public Acts, Senate Bills and House Bills that directly impact the MNRTF program.

PA 117 of 2011 – Full Payment in-lieu of Taxes (PILT) on MNRTF Acquired Land – Representative Joel Johnson. This act requires the Legislature to make annual appropriations from the MNRTF in order to make full payments in lieu of taxes on State-owned land purchased through the MNRTF. This bill has been enacted and signed by the Governor.

Liesman (Financial Analyst), Ms. Jule Stafford (Grant Coordinator), Ms. Shamika Askew-Storay (Grant Coordinator), and Ms. Tamara Jorkasky (Grant Coordinator). Ms. Christie Bayus, another Grant Coordinator, was not in attendance. Also in attendance were Mr. Joseph Frick, Assistant Chief, Finance and Operations Division; and Ms. Tina Stojakovich, Marketing and Outreach Division (assigned to Grants Management's grant programs). There is a lot of marketing being done for the MNRTF, and Ms. Stojakovich will be making a presentation at a future Board meeting.

Mr. Charters asked Mr. Olson how the grants were awarded in Parks and Recreation Division. Mr. DeBrabander will outline. Mr. Charters also asked about horse trails. Mr. Olson responded that there have been some improvements made. Mr. Charters asked if there was any discussion on bridle fees. 
This plan has been shared with the township and they are in support for these changes.



Pat and I reviewed the proposed entrance onto Boyne City Road this morning. We measured the sign distance for the proposed entrance location and feel the proposed entrance is in the optimal location.

The proposed entrance stopping sight distance and intersection sight distance exceeds the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) guidelines. Looking westerly (towards Charlevoix) there is approximately 995-FT of sight distance, and looking easterly there is over 995-FT of sight distance (AASHTO recommends 495-FT of stopping sight distance and 610-FT of Intersection sight distance).

This letter is to clarify the Road Commission's statement in a previous letter dated April 20, 2017 regarding the existing and proposed new entrance for Camp Seagull on Boyne City

The Road Commission's practice regarding sight distance measurements are based exclusively and entirely upon the AASHTO (American Association of State Highway and Traffic Officials) sight distance principles, theories, and methodologies. With that said, the Road Commission performed an on-sight review of the existing and proposed Camp Seagull entrances onto Boyne City Road to analyze the feasibility of improving the existing entrance or building a new entrance to meet AASHTO intersection sight distance safety requirements.

Since Camp Seagull's "use" is changing from a previously used summer camp, to a township multi-use park, the types of vehicles entering and leaving the property will also be changing. Since a boat launch onto Lake Charlevoix is being proposed, there will be vehicles with boat trailers entering/exiting the park. With this vehicle type configuration, and other vehicle types that will be utilizing the park, the existing entrance does not meet AASHTO intersection sight distance requirements.

In light of the Road Commissions review of the existing and proposed entrances onto Boyne City Road, the Road Commissions requires a new entrance to be located at the East end of the park property, as shown on Performance Engineering drawing dated March 10, 2015, and as shown on the Hayes Township Camp Sea-Gull Park Master Plan (see page 24).
