Hi Ron,

I recently received an e-mail from Jim McMahon saying that a representative from Rieth-Riley will be invited to the Monday March 13 Board of Trustees meeting to answer questions from the Bay Shore community about the newest additional mining phase which is to begin in April.

I strongly believe that a BOT meeting is not the best time and venue for that. I am asking you to rescind the invitation to Rieth-Riley and call a Special Meeting dedicated to only the gravel pit operation. There simply is not enough time at a BOT meeting given the time restraints, multiple agenda items and 3 minute community comment format to give community members the time they deserve to ask questions and their valid concerns be heard.

I am also very displeased by both the Township and Rieth-Riley's continued ignoring the Intervenor. We have NOT received any copies of past nor present correspondence between the Township and Rieth-Riley regarding pit operations nor future mining plans. We were not even notified of the recent Bauer Company visitation to the pit to determine its "restoration" status. If you had invited me, I could have told you that the original 30 acres along Petoskey Street is not restored as required in the Consent Judgement. I have lived here, along with other Intervenor and we closely watched the initial preparation to mine that phase. No one present on the recent site evaluation lived in the area when this all began and the Bauer representative is new to this operation. The annual site evaluation I attended was with Don Griffin of H& D, Ethel Knepp and Tony Bauer himself.

Because of the extremely short and unofficial notice of the attendance of Rieth-Riley at the meeting on Monday, neither Kim Fary nor I can attend. Our community deserves better. In addition to myself as the lead Intervenor, there are several Intervenor still living in Bay Shore. They need to be informed as well as the Bay Shore community of any public meeting with Rieth-Riley staff. Scheduling a Special Meeting will give Kim and I time to do that.

Please schedule a Special Meeting for all the legal parties and the Bay Shore community to discuss the upcoming new mining phase and the future of the gravel mine. Also notify Kim Fary and I so we can inform the Intervenor and community members.

Hello Hayes Township Board,

Attached below is a set of questions that were prepared for the Rieth-Riley mining discussion at the Monday evening BOT meeting. Near the end of the questions, an Environmental Bond is mentioned. Many, many people in both Bay Shore and Michigan Shores are very concerned about the continued mining and the processing of this material.

This mining and processing operations have been active for at least 60 years. As you well know, people are concerned about their air quality, drinking water, all aspects of safety, and a tranquil place to live. We are hoping that an Environmental Bond of sufficient size will guarantee all precautions are taken to protect what we have. That's one of the reasons for this Environmental Bond. We hope you see the benefit and fairness of this. If enacted, Hayes Township would be the holder of the bond.

Secondly, one of the last questions mentions cost / benefit analysis of this mining project, asking Rieth-Riley to share that information with the township. Of course, they must operate their business within their operating parameters, but also looking out for the local community.

The cost of housing is extremely high now. From a business analysis perspective, it may be more advantageous for Rieth-Riley to sell the property for housing now before removing all of the soil materials. Perhaps, they could locate an alternate source of sand and gravel for their business.

Bay Shore is an ideal central location for housing for industrious working people. Both Emmet and Charlevoix counties have inexpensive county busing that serves Bay Shore. County buses travel to all cities and communities within Emmet and Charlevoix counties. There are lots of advantages to pursue this alternative development before more mining is done.

I'm hoping this topic could be suggested at the meeting on Monday.

Hopefully, you see the benefits of this. It's a win-win for everyone.

Thank you Rieth-Riley for presenting details of your upcoming sand and gravel extraction project to the Hayes Township community.

Your reputation: Rieth-Riley is known as a leader in safety for its employees and the communities where it works. You pride yourself as a 100% employee-owned company with a community-centered culture. You have a “safety and health” culture.

Hayes Township and Bay Shore / Michigan Shores are pleased to work with a company of your caliber.

We are naturally very concerned about your upcoming project and the care taken in keeping our community environmentally safe and healthy and a place of extraordinary natural beauty. Natural resources have been extracted from this area, going back to the 19th century. Your people, your employees, live here and also enjoy the natural beautiful environment. 12. Profit margin: Is Rieth-Riley making a profit on the sale of these sand and gravel finished products?

13. Environmental bond: As you can see from these questions, the community is very concerned about the negative consequences of mining, sand and gravel processing, transportation, rock crushing, and related activities. It is difficult to put a price on potential environmental and personal damage. An environmental damage bond of \$10,000,000 may be suitable to cover many situations.

14. Cost effective: Is this project really cost effective and beneficial to the community, given all of the questions here?
