The May 2nd, 2025, special meeting of the Hayes Township Board was called to order by Treasurer Julie Collard at 6:00 pm.

Board members present were Matt Cunningham (Trustee), Julie Collard (Treasurer), Doug Kuebler (Trustee), and Kristin Baranski (Clerk), and William Conklin.

CALL TO ORDER

Supervisor William Conklin called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm.

REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF AGENDA:

Ms. Baranski made a motion, supported by Mr. Kuebler, to approve the May 2nd 2025 Special Meeting Agenda as presented.

Yeas: Matt Cunningham, Julie Collard, Doug Kuebler, William Conklin, and Kristin Baranski.

Nays: None **Motion Carried**

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

Public comment opened at 6:05 pm.

Comments included:

- Requested information on any money that will be received by the state to help with storm clean up. Requested information of on what the scope of the clean up will be. Will Private drives be included in the clean up?
- Mr. Conklin stated he went to a meeting with FEMA and they stated receiving money may be slim to none. Stated the clean up will include what people put along the roadways after notice is sent out if the board approves the bid at tonight's evening. Private drives will be included as long as the landowners of the private drive allows for it.
- Thanked the board discussing the storm clean up. EMS also went to FEMA and it will depend on the Federal Government accepting it as a federal level disaster. Stated they are disappointed in the road commissions progress.

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Would like the township to reach out to the Conservancy for an option for a drop off point.

- Ms. Baranski stated the Conservancy has been reached out to and waiting to hear back from them.
- Stated volunteer groups have been helpful with clean up, however, there is still a large amount of debris down. Will the hired contractor chip up debris in front of empty lots or just in front of homes?
- Thanked Bill for speaking with him for coming out to speak, he has a large amount of damage at his home. Will the road commission address trees that are leaning or have down in the road right away? Stated two radio towers were lost in this storm, the amount of ice and damage from this storm was unheard of. Would like to Township to use grant money or township or county funds to help people with the damage.
- Mr. Conklin stated the road commission has indicated they will be around to clear up any widow makers.
- Stated will there be a limit on the amount of debris allowed to bring out to the road side. Would like more time to gather everything to the edge of the road.
- Mr. Conklin stated there will not be a limit and volunteer group are available to help residence move debris.
- Requested if the bid is only for a limited amount of houses, that work in the landscaping business and they feel the bid is very low for the entire township. Is it fair for the township to pay for only part of the residences clean up, some residence have already paid for the clean up of their property.
- Stated has the township received more then one proposal for the clean up. Will the money spent on the storm clean up eliminate the possibility of a spring clean up next year?
- Mr. Conklin stated he reached out to other landscaping companies and no one else was interested. The bid for the clean up is \$30,000 and a grant of \$10,000 is available.
- Thanked for looking into grants available, is part of the grant expected to be used for people in need?
- Mr. Conklin stated if the township does not approve the bid, the township can still use the grant money for any clean up needs.

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- Stated MDOT and the Road Commission has been out clearing (road right of way)ROW, asked if they will be continuing to do so? Also, what the bid in that case would cover.
- Mr. Conklin stated the Road Commission will continue to work however the work may take all summer.
- Mr. Conklin confirmed that Mr. Tasker stated that he would collect debris along side of road, even in front of a vacant property.
- Ms. Baranski stated MDOT was here working for two weeks and now have left the Road Commission extra equipment to continue the work, however, it will take time due to the road commission having other task like grading to begin soon.

Closed at 6:37.

HAYES TOWNSHIP STORM CLEAN UP:

Walker Tasker gave a brief presentation of what work would be included in his bid. Any brush along the road, empty lot or not, the brush along road ways will be cleared. No payment will be accepted until the Township is satisfied the work is complete.

The Hayes Township Board of Trustees discussed storm clean up in Hayes Township:

- Ms. Baranski requested more information from Bill Conklin regarding the township insurance.
- Mr. Conklin stated in the event the Township does not approve the bid, He would like to see the grant money go towards a volunteer group that will help residence clean up storm debris.
- Ms. Baranski stated she has received many calls and emails from residents that have already cleaned up their property or paid to have their property clean up and find it wrong for the township to spend money on other residents property and not theirs.
- Mr. Conklin stated he feels it is in the opinion of each individual board member. He has a list of residence they have contacted him for help that he will help. If someone complains about cleaning up their property before reaching out to him then they rushed their clean up and did not do enough research before paying too much for clean up, that is on them

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- Ms. Baranski stated the road commission and sheriff requested people to not drag debris to the ROW. However, Bill told people to put stuff in the ROW on Nine Mile Point and now the Road Commission will not do anything on Nine Mile Point.
- Mr. Conklin stated he did tell people on Nine Mile Point to put debris on the side of the road and he will chip it if the property owners pay the \$600 dollar rental fee for the chipper and truck.
- Mr. Conklin stated he will not be able to vote on approving the bid from Mr. Walter, due to being his legal representative and that is how he knew about his company.
- Ms. Collard stated she has received mixed comments regarding the bid for tonight's meeting. She stated she has been comparing this clean up to the spring clean up process which is notified and available to all residents. It feels uncomfortable spending tax payers money when it will not benefit all residents.
- Mr. Cunningham supported the previous comment and suggested for residents to looking into their home-owners insurance.
- Ms. Baranski stated the road commission will be around to chip all the roads it may just take months for them to clear it all. Suggested a drop off point.
- The conservancy has been contacted for a possible drop off point where the Township could then chip the debris.
- Ms. Collard stated she feels Bill has gone rogue and made promises and gave false information to people before researching and receiving board approval. Unfortunately with him doing it this way he has placed the rest of the members of the board in a bad place.
- Mr. Conklin stated he would propose using ARPA money for the remaining \$20,000 of the bid.
- Mr. Cunningham stated he would like to help everyone as much as he can, however they have to consider every resident when considering spending Township money.
- Mr. Kuebler stated they have to consider every tax payers needs when spending township money.
- Ms. Collard stated she would like to have any landscaping company willing to help information to share with residents.
- Ms. Collard requested a five minute recess.
- Ms. Baranski stated they do not make these kind of decisions easily, and it is difficult for any of the board members to decide to not help, however they have to consider

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every tax payer when making a decision to spend taxpayer money because they have to be fair to all residents.

- Ms. Baranski stated at the cemetery five large pine trees have fallen at the cemetery.

Ms. Baranski made a motion, supported by Mr Kuebler to approve the bid from Rainey Landscaping in the amount of \$1500.00 for the Undine Cemetery storm clean up.

Ms. Collard stated the board is trying to be fair across the board for all residents within the township.

Ms. Baranski would like to see the hostility from the Supervisor towards the rest of the board stop.

Ms. Collard stated the township will continue posting options for residents to help with clean up. Would like to caution Bill in the future to not make promises and instructions to residence without the proper information and township approval.

Mr. Conklin stated he did not give any residence on his list instructions to do anything until after a special meeting was held. He did not start chipping until the weekend of the 26th. He is not responding to everyone in the Township, only people who have reached out to him.

Mr. Cunningham stated he thought at the last meeting they had covered and closed this matter. If the Township is going to continue this discussion they should look to get more than one bid.

Mr. Kuebler felt the storm clean up was decided on at the last Special Meeting.

Ms. Baranski stated she has heard with the township approving a bid from an out of town business for a township wide clean it would take business away from local businesses. However would consider an equitable approve and match the grant money with township money.

Mr. Conklin stated he would rather have the bid of \$30,000 approved for the whole township. Only a couple people will then need volunteer groups to help them within their property.

Mr. Conklin requested the \$10,000 to go to him to help people with clean up. He did not apply or complain about volunteering his time and money until Ms. Baranski called him and suggested he needed help.

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Ms. Collard stated the grant money would have to be used for the township as a whole not selected. However, she would consider approving the motion from earlier.

Ms. Baranski made a motion, supported by Ms. Collard to accept the proposed bid from W&W Tree Service to include all debris on the side of the road in the amount of \$30,000. ARPA funds will be used to cover \$20,000 and a \$10,000 will be paid from the grant.

I Think that I should ask Edwin Bellairs if he is interested in putting in a bid as well since he asked at April 13 meeting why nobody contacted him and he lives on Maj Doug Sloan Rd - Ed and I cut down that Birch Tree on Maj Doug Sloan Rd near Greensky Hill last week so we have been talking -

If any State or Federal aid should come, it should be given to the property owner(s) to help reimburse the costs of clean up.

However, I have also witnessed first hand individuals and companies trying too, or taking advantage of this disaster!! Myself, as well as many residents would be enraged if any funding the Township received, for this historic event, would go toward lining the pockets of those individuals or companies.

This Township needs to have a better plan and understanding of where additional funding should be going too (or distributed).
