Sir or Madam:

It has come to the attention of this department that a violation of the District Sanitary Code (the Code) for Charlevoix County has occurred on the above listed property. The violation is in regard to the unlawful construction of a privy toilet structure to serve the newly constructed/renovated township park/lake access.

The construction of the toilet facilities without approval and permit(s) from this department constitute violations of Sections 4-1, 4-2 and 4-3 of the Code. Such violations carry potential penalty as provided for within Article XII of the Code.

Enclosed is an application for a permit for the sewage facilities installed. The application shall be completed and submitted to the Charlevoix office of the Health Department of Northwest Michigan no later than July 17, 2020. The fee for this application is \$756 due to the failure to apply as required. If any other sewage facilities have been installed or are planned to be installed, separate applications shall be submitted for these facilities as well.

Be advised that failure to comply with this corrective order or its deadline will result in further administrative action as provided for within Article XII of the Code.

MARION TOWNSHIP CONSUMER FIREWORKS ORDINANCE Ordinance No. 2 of 2018

AN ORDINANCE PURSUANT TO ACT 256 OF THE PUBLIC ACTS OF 2011, AS AMENDED, AND PURSUANT ACT TO 246 OF THE PUBLIC ACTS OF 1945, AS AMENDED, TO PROHIBIT THE IGNITION, DISCHARGE, AND USE OF CONSUMER FIREWORKS WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP ON DAYS OTHER THAN THE DAY PRECEDING, THE DAY OF, OR THE DAY AFTER A NATIONAL HOLIDAY, TO PROHIBIT THE IGNITION, DISCHARGE, AND USE OF CONSUMER FIREWORKS WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP BETWEEN 1 A.M. AND 8 A.M. ON THE DAY PRECEDING, THE DAY OF, OR THE DAY AFTER A NATIONAL HOLIDAY, AND TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF

THE TOWNSHIP OF MARION

ORDAINS: Section 1. Findings.

The Marion Township Board makes the following findings: Public Act 246 of 1945 (MCL 41.181, et seq.) authorizes Marion Township to enact ordinances that regulate the public health, safety and general welfare of persons and property. Public Act 256 of 2011, as amended (MCL 28.451, et seq.) authorizes Marion Township to enact an ordinance regulating the ignition, discharge, and use of consumer fireworks. The Marion Township Board hereby finds that an ordinance prohibiting the ignition, discharge, and use of consumer fireworks, to the extent allowed by Public Act 256 of 2011, as amended, is in the interest of public health, safety and general welfare of persons and property within Marion Township.

Section 2. Title.,

This Ordinance shall be known as the Marion Township Consumer Fireworks Ordinance.

Section 3. Definitions.

This Ordinance shall be interpreted in accordance with the definitions included in Public Act 256 of 2011, as amended, and as interpreted by the Michigan Courts.

Section 9. Severability.

If any section, provision or clause of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, such invalidity shall not effect any remaining portions or application of this Ordinance, which can be given effect without the invalid portion or application.

Section 10. Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days after being published in a newspaper of general circulation within the Township.

Publication: This Ordinance was published in the Petoskey News Review on April 10, 2018 with an effective date of May 10, 2018.

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT shall be deemed effective on 6/27, 2018 between Marion Township, a Michigan general law township, and the Charlevoix County Sheriff.

Recitals

- A. Marion Township has enacted a Consumer Fireworks Ordinance prohibiting the ignition, discharge, and use of consumer fireworks in the township to the maximum extent permissible under state law (the "Ordinance").
- B. Marion Township does not have a police department to utilize for the enforcement of the Ordinance.
- C. Under MCL 41.181(1) the Sheriff is empowered to enforce local township ordinances pursuant to a contract for such services.
- D. The Charlevoix County Sheriff has the personnel with the training and experience necessary to enforce the Ordinance, and desires to assist Marion Township in the enforcement of the Ordinance.
- E. Because the extent and.nature of the ordinance enforcement by the Sheriff and his deputies contemplated by this Agreement will be relatively minor, no township funds are needed in connection with this Agreement.

Agreement

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises contained herein, the parties hereby agree as follows:

- 1. The Charlevoix County Sheriff agrees that his deputies shall enforce the Ordinance under the terms and conditions of this Agreement.
- 2. Marion Township acknowledges and agrees that when enforcing the Ordinance, the Sheriff and his deputies, in the sole exercise of their professional judgment, are free to take whatever action they deem necessary and proper to enforce the ordinance. Marion Township further acknowledges and agrees that the discretion granted to the Sheriff and his deputies in this paragraph includes the discretion to take no enforcement action, if the, sheriff and his deputies deem this action warranted under the circumstances.
- The Charlevoix County Sheriff agrees that any expenses incurred in the enforcement of the Ordinance, including but not limited to the expenses

associated with required court appearances by him or his deputies, shall not be passed on to Marion Township, but shall be considered an expense of the Sheriff's Office.

- 4. Each party shall indemnify and hold the other party, its officers, board members, assigns, agents, servants, employees, insurance companies, harmless from any and all damages, legal fees or expenses, awards, demands, rights, and causes of action which arise from that party's actions in the enforcement of the Ordinance.
- 5. Either party may terminate this Agreement upon seven (7) days written notice to the other party.
